HERSTORY

The establishment of the TESDA Women's Center (TWC) formerly known as the National Vocational Training and Development Center for Women (NVTDCW) started in 1993 when former Senator Leticia Ramos-Shahani met with members of the Japanese Diet.

Between 1996 and 1997, the Exchange of Notes for the Project was done. A grant aid from the Japanese Government thru the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), an amount of 2.620 Billion Japanese Yen (USD 23.82M) was provided for the construction of the Center and a Dormitory which was inaugurated in 1998.

Initially, the TWC offered ten (10) Pre-Employment trainings focusing on Non-Traditional Trades (NTT) and now it has 21 Registered Training Programs and 18 Assessment Centers.

TWC was recognized as a 2008 Silver Awardee by the Asia Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC) and Gold in 2018, extended up to 2023.

In 2019, the TWC was selected as one of the three (3) pilot institutions of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization -International Centre for Technical and Vocational Education and Training (UNESCO-UNEVOC) International Centre Skills for Innovation Hubs (i-hubs) project in the Asia-Pacific, landing among the total ten (10) pilot i-hubs centres around the world.

TWC as GAD Secretariat to the TESDA GAD Focal Point System (GFPS) assisted TESDA to attain the 2014 GADtimpala Award as one of the Outstanding Gender-Responsive Government Agencies and 2019 GADtimpala Award for the TESDA - Coca-Cola Philippines STAR

COMPETENCY-BASED TECHNICAL-VOCATIONAL **EDUCATION AND TRAINING** (CBTVET)

It refers to a system that focuses on attainment of the outcomes driven by standards to a specific level of competency.

PRINCIPLES

- 1. Course design is based on competency standards set by the industry or recognized industry sector. (Learning system is driven by competencies written to industry standards)
- 2. Training delivery is learner-centered and should accommodate individualized and self-paced learning strategies.
- 3. Training can be done in an actual workplace setting, simulation of a workplace and/or through adoption of modern technology.
- 4. Assessment is based on the collection of evidence of the performance of work to the industry required standards.
- 5. Assessment of competency takes the trainee's knowledge and attitude into account but requires evidence of actual performance of the competency as the primary source of evidence;
- 6. Training program allows for recognition of prior learning (RPL) or current competencies.
- 7. Training completion is based on satisfactory performance of all specified competencies not on the nominal duration of learning.
