TWC graduates 1st batch of FeLS Trainers

On December 14, 2020, TWC culminated its first batch of 25 trainees for the Facilitate e-Learning Sessions (FeLS) course.

This training is being conducted online and a requirement for trainers who wish to conduct their training through the various delivery modes which have been allowed during this time of pandemic.

The first batch who finished are trainers from various TTI's and TVI's in NCR and Region IV-A.

FeLS run for 80 hours and is com-

posed of Institutional Assessment, Written Exam, Portfolio, and Demonstration with Oral Questioning which leads to the acquisition of three competencies for the course.

TWC trainer and FeLS Regional Lead Trainer, Ms. Kimberly G. Bautista conducts the training and assessment to evaluate the readiness of the students for online delivery.

The first batch are also part of the pilot testing of e-TESDA for their multiregional Learning Management system (LMS). Currently, TWC is on its second batch of FeLS trainees.

Dressmaking Trainer tap for online Webinar

The TWC Dressmaking Trainer, Irene B. Mortel was tapped as one of the resource persons for the online webinar and skills-share on October 10 and 12 for the "Choose to Reuse Project and Campaign" of Ecowaste Coalition and in collaboration with the Swedish Society for Nature Conservation (SSNC) for the upcoming Green Action Week this mid-October 2020.

In connection with this campaign, a mobilized group of frontline waste recyclers and semi-skilled sewers from Taytay, Rizal, Manila, Cebu, and Quezon City were educated about the following: [1] recommended materials for non-medical face masks; and [2] recommended specifications, patterns, and production of reusable cloth masks.

The said project/campaign aims to promote the use of reusable cloth masks among the general public and inso-doing, reduce the volume of wanton littering, misuse, and inappropriate disposal of disposable medical masks. Immediately after the skills-share, the trainees will receive seed capital from EWC and SSNC to jumpstart their respective livelihoods through sewing/production of reusable cloth face masks.

TWC Lunches its Online Application and Enrolment Program



Application for Free Skills Training is now easier at TWC thru its Online Application and Enrolment Program.

All applicants who wish to avail of the free skills training provided by the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) through TESDA Women's Center in NCR can now file their trainee application using the TWC Online Application and Enrollment Program.

With the advent of the COVID-19 pandemic in the country, the TESDA Women's Center opened its online

application program yesterday, July 13, 2020 to extend its services and reach a wider range of potential applicants who wish to file their application for the free skills training without having the trouble to visit the campus in Taguig.

This program of TWC was developed to limit face-toface transactions and to avoid physical contacts when applying to ensure the safety of both the TWC personnel and visiting applicants.

The online program follows the same process of application where the applicant is required to fill-out the learner's profile and will proceed to the online written interview. Once the applicant is done with the latter, he/she will have to take the qualifying exam which is time limited. If the applicant did not pass the exam he/she can still retake the exam until qualified.

The applicants will also need to upload a softcopy of their requirements as part of the initial verification and will have to handover a hardcopy to the registrar when they started their training at TWC.

All applicants who wish to file their applications may now visit the TWC website thru the Online Application Portal: https://twc.tesda.gov.ph/twconlineapplication/ to begin their process.


