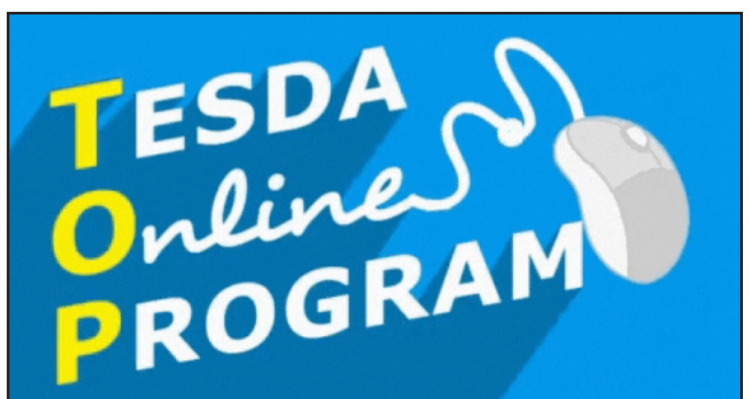

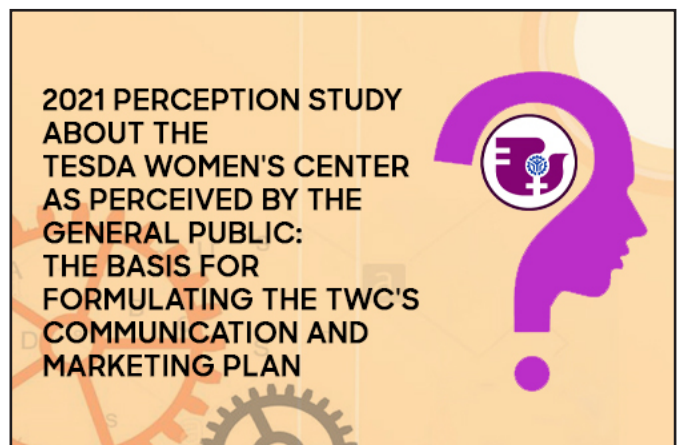
2021 Perception Study about the TESDA Women's Center as Perceived by the General Public: The Basis for Formulating the TWC's Communication and Marketing Plan

This study is an effort to find out and measure how the general public views and feels about the TESDA Women's Center in consideration of the twenty-three (23) years of public service, especially for women's empowerment and gender equality promotion in the technical vocational education and training (TVET) sector.

This quantitative study used an online perception survey tool in an attempt to determine the extent of a relationship between the respondent's demographics or profile and their subjective impressions, if any, about TWC.

Through this research, the Center will have a foundation of the public's opinions or even misperceptions about TWC aimed at bridging the right and effective communications to the public by means of a well-grounded communication and marketing plan and strategies.

In a presentation, TWC showed and explained its operation processes and procedures in accepting applicants and enrollees of TWC's free training programs. Ms. Aileen took notes and shared her thoughts of their findings to TWC's operation processes. She gave tips and precious advice to TWC as it will be subjected to a mock audit and inspection in preparation for ISO 9001:2015.

Also present in the meeting were Vladimir John

Macapugay, TESD Specialist I from the Learning and Development Division, National Institute for Technical Education and Skills Development (LLD-NITESD), joined via Zoom were TESDA Regional Training Center - VIII (RTC - VIII) in Tacloban City and Davao Oriental Polytechnic Institute (DOPI) in Lupon, Davao Oriental.

The team inspected the operations of the Information and Referral Office (IRO), Registrar's Office, Assessment Focal Counter. Also visited were the Office of the Center Chief and selected workshops. They observed how TWC interacts with its clients, she looked on to the forms and asked few questions with the IRO Officer. After then, the team proceeded to the Registrar's Office and asked few questions to the registrar. They inspected the documents that were submitted to the registrar by the enrollees.

The team toured the TWC facilities and they were accompanied by Mylene H. Somera, Supervising TESD Specialist.

Overall, the team was impressed to the systematic process of TWC's enrollment process.

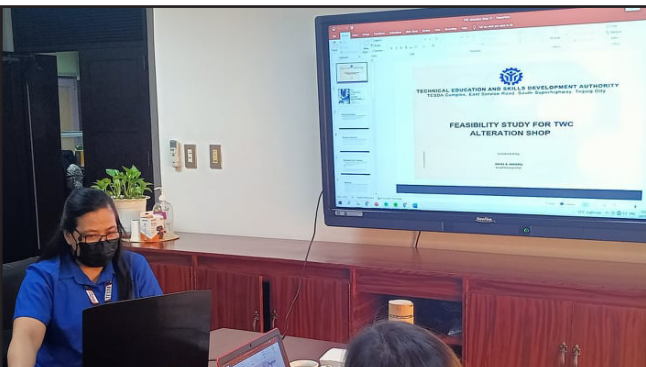

The presented Research Studies are the following:

1. 3. Development of a Virtual Reality Simulator in Cocktail Mixing for Bartending NC II (The Mixologist-XYOLO) by Shella D. Bawar, Trainer, Bartending NC II;
4. Pilot Production of Blue Pea Lemonade as a Ready-Drink Beverage by Shella D. Bawar, Trainer, Bartending NC II; and
5. Feasibility Study for TWC Alteration Shop by Irene B. Mortel, Senior TESD Specialist.

Each authors were given 20 minutes to present their research studies and 10 minutes the questions and answers the questions of the panel members.
