

# TESDA Women's Center Leads Gender Sensitivity Training to New Batch of Trainees

Practical scenarios and engaging exercises are incorporated into the training to enhance the learning experience. These activities allow trainees to apply their knowledge and skills to real-life situations, strengthening their ability to address gender-related challenges. Through active participation and constructive dialogue, the program encourages shared responsibility and collective action for a gender-sensitive workplace.

The implementation of the Gender Sensitivity Training reflects TWC's commitment to empowering trainees as advocates for gender equality.

## TESDA Women's Center Oversees another Batch of Gender Sensitivity Training to Trainees

Following the successful conduct of Gender Sensitivity Training (GST) on the first week of May, the TWC team of facilitators conducted the 2nd batch of GST for the trainees on May 9, 2024.

The whole-day GST was attended by a total of 91 trainees from the following qualifications: Food & Beverage Services NC II, Housekeeping NC II, Bartending NC II, and Shielded Metal Arc Welding NC II.

Participants were composed of 54% female and 42% male. The training covered foundational Gender and Development (GAD) concepts, SOGIESC 101, and involved various activities to analyze the causes of gender issues and recommend solutions for a more inclusive and safe TVET environment.

TWC regularly conducts GST for Trainees and their parents or guardians, Trainers and other staff members, Industry Partners, and people in the community.





# **TESDA** Women's Center Supports Pilot Testing of the Gender-Responsive Checklist for Instructional Materials in TVET



In line with TESDA's commitment to gender equality, TESDA, through its Gender and Development (GAD) Focal Point System, collaborates with the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) to integrate inclusivity into standards, curriculum, and learning materials.

From May 9-10, 2024, GAD Focals and Trainers holding Trainers Methodology (TM) Level II from 17 TESDA Regional/Provincial Offices, with observers from the Central office, participated in the Pilot Testing of the Gender-Responsive Checklist for Instructional Materials in TVET at Brentwood Suites, Quezon City.

During this Pilot Testing, participants actively utilized the checklist, offering invaluable feedback for its enhancement before its official launch. This initiative highlights TESDA's unwavering commitment to fostering a training environment that embraces gender-fair and inclusive TVET.

#### TESDA-CSITE Benchmarks on TESDA Women's Center

The TWC as the first institution in the Philippines with Platinum Level award in the Asia Pacific Accreditation and Certification Commission (APACC), hosted the benchmarking activity of the Cordillera State Institute of Technical Education (TESDA-CSITE) on June 10, 2024. The CSITE group was led by Felixberto B. Matute Jr., the Acting Administrator of CSITE.

The benchmarking activity aims to learn from TWC's best practices and gain insights on the process of APACC application. During the visit, the TWC team presented information about the affirmations, commendations, and recommendations from TWC's APACC validations in 2018 and 2023. The TWC team also shared details about TWC's 2023 accomplishments.

Additionally, the CSITE group was given a tour of training laboratories and facilities.

The benchmarking activity provided an opportunity for the CSITE team to observe and learn from TWC's wins from challenges and best practices that can also be applied to CSITE to improve their current systems and operations.





# Provincial Administrator of Maguindanao del Sur Visits TESDA Women's Center

# TWC Visits a Women's Center Facility in Maguindanao Del Sur, BARMM: Building Collaborations to Expand Women's Empowerment in TVET in the Communities

With guidance and support from the TESDA Director General, Sec. Suharto "Teng" Mangudadatu, Ph.D., the following TESDA Official and Personnel visited a Women's Center Facility in Buluan, Maguindanao Del Sur, BARMM on June 4-5, 2024: PLO Executive Director Floramel Joy Sonsong, TWC Chief Mylene Somera, and Senior TESD Specialist and GAD Focal, Joenna Tabu Tattao

The activity was aimed at achieving the following objectives: (1) Visit and assess the Women's Center Facility to determine the needs of the target TVET beneficiaries in the community; (2) Conduct consultations with the local government Maguindanao Del Sur and nearby Offices to understand the processes, challenges, and opportunities to empower more women in the communities; (3) Provide recommendations to the Local Government of Maguindanao Del Sur on how to adopt the good practices of TWC/NTCW and to mainstream other GADrelated enabling mechanisms in the organization; and (4) Strengthen the nationwide expansion of programs and services of TWC/NTCW in line with the advocacy to promote gender equality and women's empowerment in TVET.

During the visit, the officials and staff members of the Provincial Government of Maguindanao Del Sur and its Facility of Maguindanao Women and Children Peace and Action Center presented the background and target programs and services of the institution primarily focused on women and girls victim-survivors of gender-based violence.



The main objectives of the facility mentioned above are also aligned with the vision of TWC: address the needs of women and girl victim-survivors of gender-based violence and women and girls in need of assistance, and assist them in the recovery and reintegration and the opportunity of continuing normal lives.

The participants from TESDA also visited the GAD Offices at the Provincial Government Offices of Maguindanao Del Sur and Sultan Kudarat to understand their current programs and services in gender mainstreaming and promoting gender equality and social inclusion in the community.



The Provincial Offices have remarkable GAD activities and advocacy activities to reach more women and those in the marginalized sectors of society.

After the 1-day On-Site Visit at the Maguindanao Women and Children Peace and Action Center, TWC shall initiate to forge a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Provincial Government of Maguindanao Del Sur to collaborate on empowering more women and girls in the communities through an area-based and demand-driven TVET and share knowledge and capabilities to further mainstream Gender and Development, Women's Empowerment, and Social Inclusion advocacies in the Facility.
